



Music Workshop.

The dining area at the Ron & Joyce Murray Centre (The Hub) is available for use by people with a disability.

Each Tuesday, the maintenance worker will lay out the chairs in a circle ready for music. Robyn Klein runs the music program. She will attend the Hub at 9am on Tuesday morning with her participant to grab out the appropriate instruments and set up the amplifier. During the music program, a staff member from the office will step in and supervise Robyn Klein's participant.

On the Tuesday...

- When arriving at the Hub the participant must pay for their session (\$20.00) The music program is offered at set days and times. These are displayed on the desk when entering the Hub.
- A risk assessment to identify the hazards facing participants has been completed. The primary method of controlling risks in the dining area are administrative controls. This translates as support workers always being involved in whichever task their participant is completing.
- Robyn Klein will run 30 minutes of the session and then there will be a break for morning tea. Tables have been set up outside for participants and their staff to use. In hot weather, the tables will be set up inside, so that participants and support workers can remain in the the airconditioning. All staff must be present and watching their clients during any meal times.
- During the session, a parachute is used with balls on top. All support staff should ensure they are watching their participants to avoid injury occurring. The balls are soft and will not cause harm.
- At the end of the program, all participants and their staff are responsible for ensuring that all instruments are put away in the correct tub. They will then have lunch.
- All seats are to be left out as the maintenance worker will put these away.
- Note: the program is noisy and may not suit those people with intolerance to loud environments.
